Parking

Please consider our neighbours and residents when parking at the nurseries. Please also be mindful that there are children coming and going from the nurseries so please drive away from the roads and car park slowly and carefully. At Hollington there is 5mph speed

limit so please follow this.

Nursery Uniform

We encourage the children to enjoy all the activities during their time at nursery and although aprons are provided, the children can often get paints, pen, mud and food etc on their clothes. Although uniform is not compulsory, we recommend it so that you can keep their clothes for good. We have moved to Super Stitch 86 for our Nursery Uniform and you can order from their website https://www.superstitch86.co.uk/product-category/nursery-play-group/artemis-nursery/



Clothes

Please can you make sure that your child's Artemis Bag is fully stocked with tops, trousers, vests, knickers or pants, socks, and a jumper or cardigan so that they have everything they need for their time at nursery. Could we also remind you to put your child's name on the clothes they wear to nursery, as well as the spare clothes, coats and hats you provide in their nursery bag. This makes it easier for staff to identify their clothes to put in their bags before they go home.

Late Collection

Could we please remind you that children need to be collected before 1.00pm or 6.00pm to ensure you receive the feedback for your child and because we have children waiting to come in for their session. Please do not arrive before your sessions starts. If you are running late, please can you phone the nursery to let them know so we can get your child ready for your arrival. There is a charge of £5.00 for every late collection passed 1.00pm or 6.00pm. This will go up every 15 minutes.

Nursery Fees

Just a reminder that your invoices need to be paid at the beginning of the month to ensure we can fund the care, food, equipment and staffing that we, as a functioning nursery are required to provide throughout the month. If you are struggling to make payments it is always

appreciated if you could contact us to discuss a payment plan. From September Invoices will now be issued through babysdays not email, so please ensure that you have all your log in details and know how to access it.

Sessions

As spaces are becoming quite full at the nurseries, please ensure you are thinking ahead about what you may be entitled to and book the days/sessions you would like from September 2025. Please also consider if you are wishing to increase as your child becomes entitled to funding or as the year progresses as once we are full, we may not be able to accommodate.

FUNDING INFORMATION!

15 Hours Funding for 2 year olds

You could be entitled to 15 hours free a week for 38 weeks of the year. Check the eligibility criteria on the East Sussex County Council Website -2 year funding. If you are eligible for this then the hours can be accessed across 3 AM's or PM's or a day and a half. Two year funding starts the term after their second birthday and they can attend this term time only or pay for the remaining 13 weeks.

<u>15 Hours Funding for</u> <u>3 & 4 year olds</u>

All 3 & 4 year funding will remain universal as 15 hours for 38 weeks of the year and can be accessed across 3 AM's or PM's or a day and a half. This funding starts the term after their third birthday, and they can attend this term time only or pay for the remaining 13 weeks.

<u>15 Hours Funding 9 month & 2 year</u> olds Working Families - NEW!

From April 2024, parents became entitled to 2 year funding, 15 hours free a week for 38 weeks of the year. Check the eligibility criteria on the childcarechoices.co.uk If you are eligible for this then the hours can be accessed across 3 AM's or PM's or a day and a half and can be used as part of additional hours. Two year funding for working parents starts the term after their second birthday and is an All Year Round offer.

<u>30 Hours Funding for</u> <u>3 & 4 year olds</u>

You could be entitled to 30 hours funding for 38 weeks of the year, leaving 13 weeks unfunded and charged for. and you will need to check the eligibility criteria on the childcarechoices.co.uk website to find out if you are eligible. You must remember to reconfirm your details every 3 months otherwise you may lose your funding. This offer is an All Year Round offer, not Term Time Only.

<u>30 Hours Funding for</u> <u>3 & 4 year olds – Stretched Offer</u>

We offer our 30 hours as a stretched offer where your little one could access 25 hours per week for 46 weeks of the year. Depending on the term they start this will depend on the remaining weeks left to either pay for or your little one remains at home. Please ask your Manager to provide you with the list of dates for

September 2025-August 2026.

Tax-Free Childcare

Tax-Free Childcare is a government scheme, to help parents with the cost of childcare. You can apply online at gov.uk/taxfreechildcare On the website you will need to check to see if you meet the eligibility criteria. You can use this alongside your child's 15 & 30 hours funding. You **can't** use Tax-Free Childcare alongside Childcare vouchers, Universal Credit or Tax Credits.

You will receive email reminders to reconfirm your details every 3 months.

Upcoming Holidays

2 & 3 Year [15 Hours Funding Term Time Only] - Half Term 17th February 2025 - 21st February 2025 Easter Holiday 31st March 2025- 18th April 2025 25 Hours Stretched, Term Time Only - Half Term 7th - 18th April 2025. 2 & 3 Year [15 Hours Funding Term Time Only] - Half Term 26th May 2025 - 30th May 2025 25 Hours Stretched, Term Time Only if Entitled from January 2025 - Half Term 26th May - 30th May 2024

2 & 3 Year [15 Hours Funding Term Time Only] - Funding Finishes 25th July 2025

Funding Starts again 8th September 2025.

From this date 30 hours funding is available for all working families of children 9 months and up and you are entitled from the term after your child turns 9 months. You must apply by the 31st August 2025 to be eligible and if you already have a working families code this will continue but must be renewed every 3 months.

World Insect Week 23rd - 29th June 2025

Throughout the week we will be looking at different animals from across the world and looking at their habitats. We will be doing 'Insect Watch' in our nursery gardens and surrounding green areas to see what we can find, marking them off on our bug hunt sheets and we will be playing insect bingo. Jaws & Claws will be visiting all three sites during this week and bringing some of their animals to share with the children. If you would like to bring in some photos of your pets from home that we can share at circle times with our friends.

Sunflower Growing Competition April 2025 - August 2025

We will be sending seeds home for you and your chid to plant in April and ask that you keep a photograph diary of their progress, measuring as you do and recording the height for us. We will invite the Sunflowers back for judging in August and all participants will get a prize, with the tallest getting a gardening set to carry on their love of planting. Please collect seeds from the nursery during April. If your child doesn't attend during the holidays then you can collect at the end of March but wait to plant.

Suggestions of how to plant your seeds:

Choose a planting site in your garden with fertile soil and ample daily sunlight.

Sow sunflower seeds 1 to 2 inches deep in the soil.

Water the seeds with a warm splash of water daily until you see sprouts, which should take about seven days.

Alternatively, sow sunflower seeds indoors in pots in March or April and plant out in May once all risk of frost is past.

Plant one seed per pot, 1.5cm deep.

Water the pots and cover them with clear plastic bags.

Give plants plenty of room, especially for low-growing varieties that will branch out.

A light application of fertilizer mixed in at planting time will encourage strong root growth to protect them from blowing over in the

wind.
